Christ the King Sunday

November 22, 2009 Christ the King Sunday marks the end of the Church Year, drawing our attention to the ultimate (though now hidden) reign of Christ over all things. The Holy Gospel (St. John 18:33-37), however, begins at a point where the "kingship" of Jesus is most hidden, as he stands before Pilate in the hours leading up to his crucifixion. The First Reading (Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14) and the Second Reading (Revelation 1:4b-8) both give us a vision of that unseen reality of the Risen Christ given power and dominion over all things.
