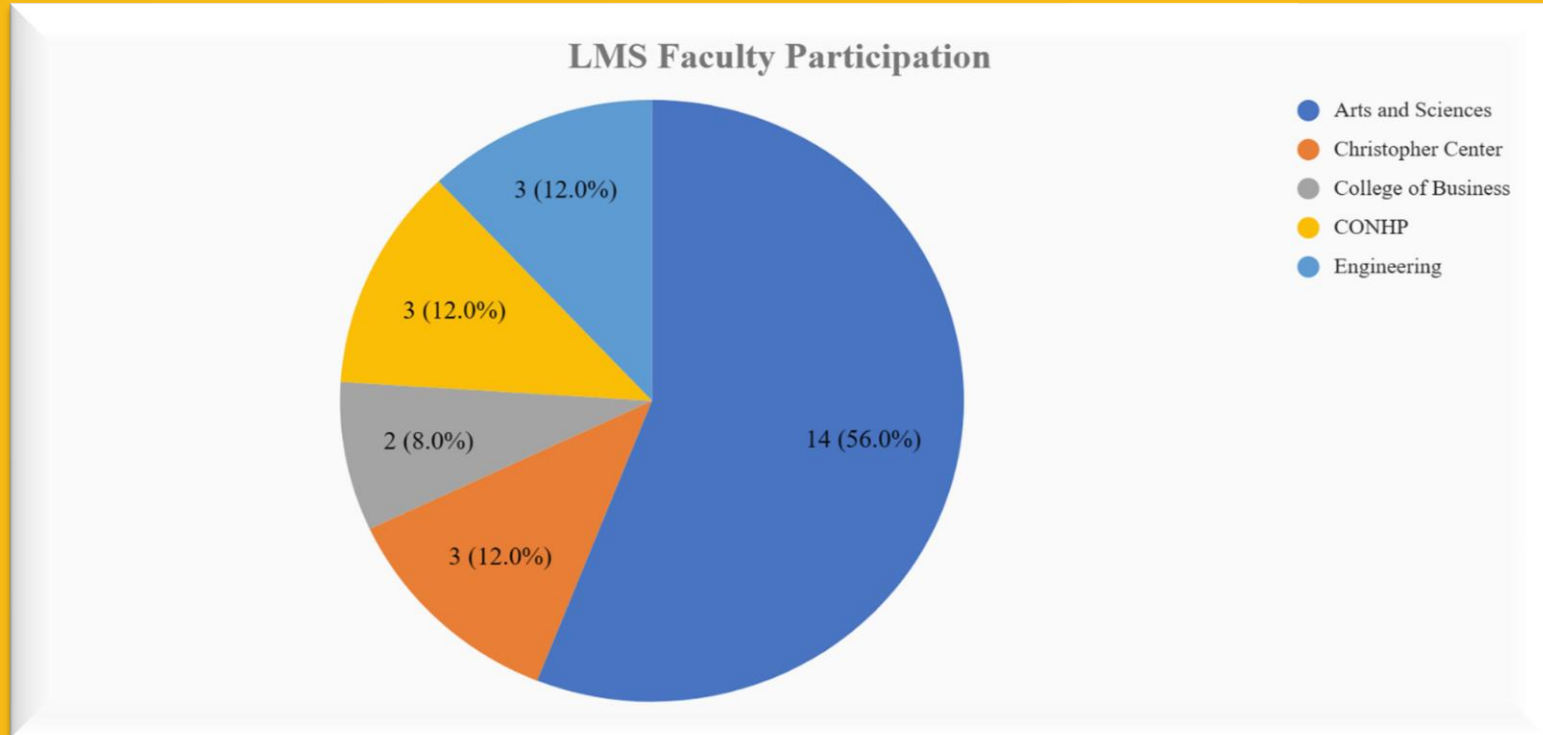

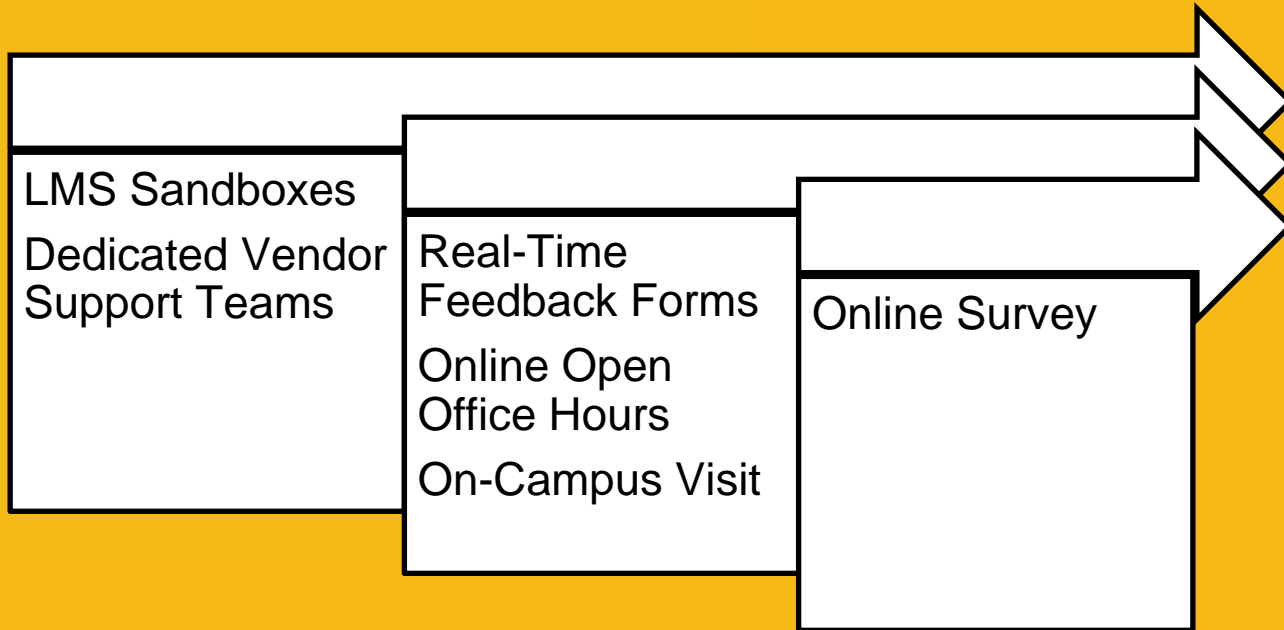

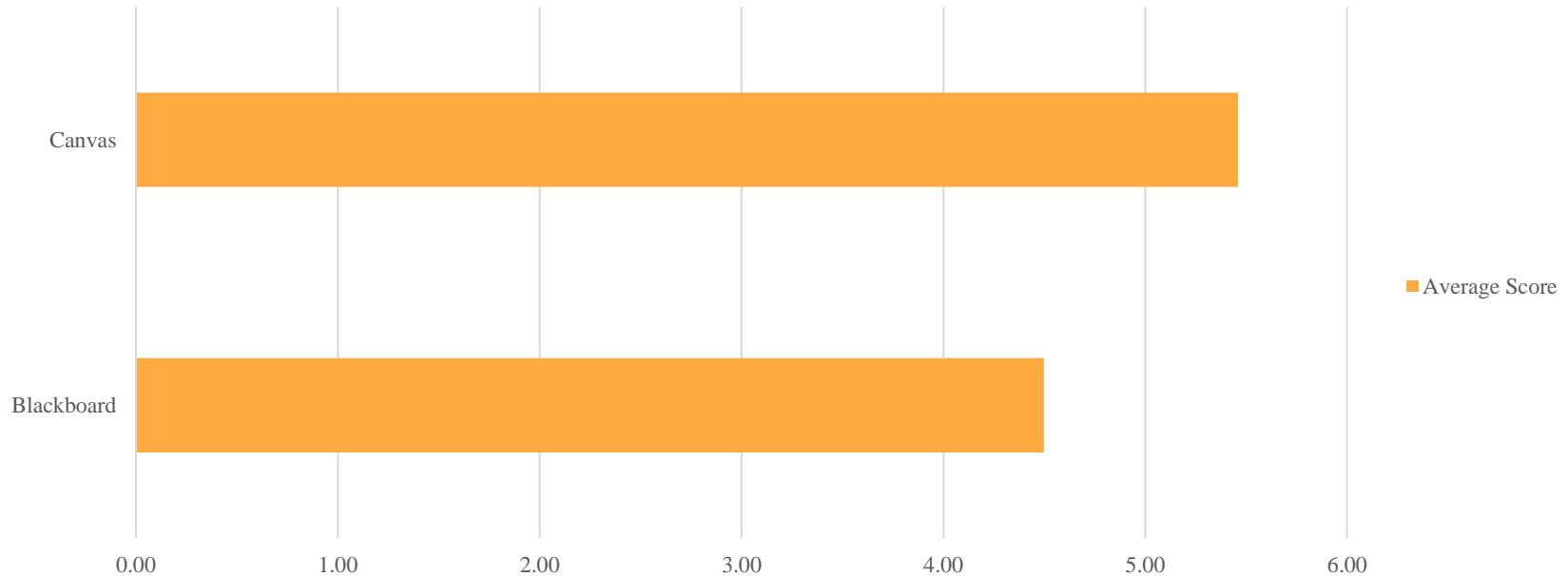

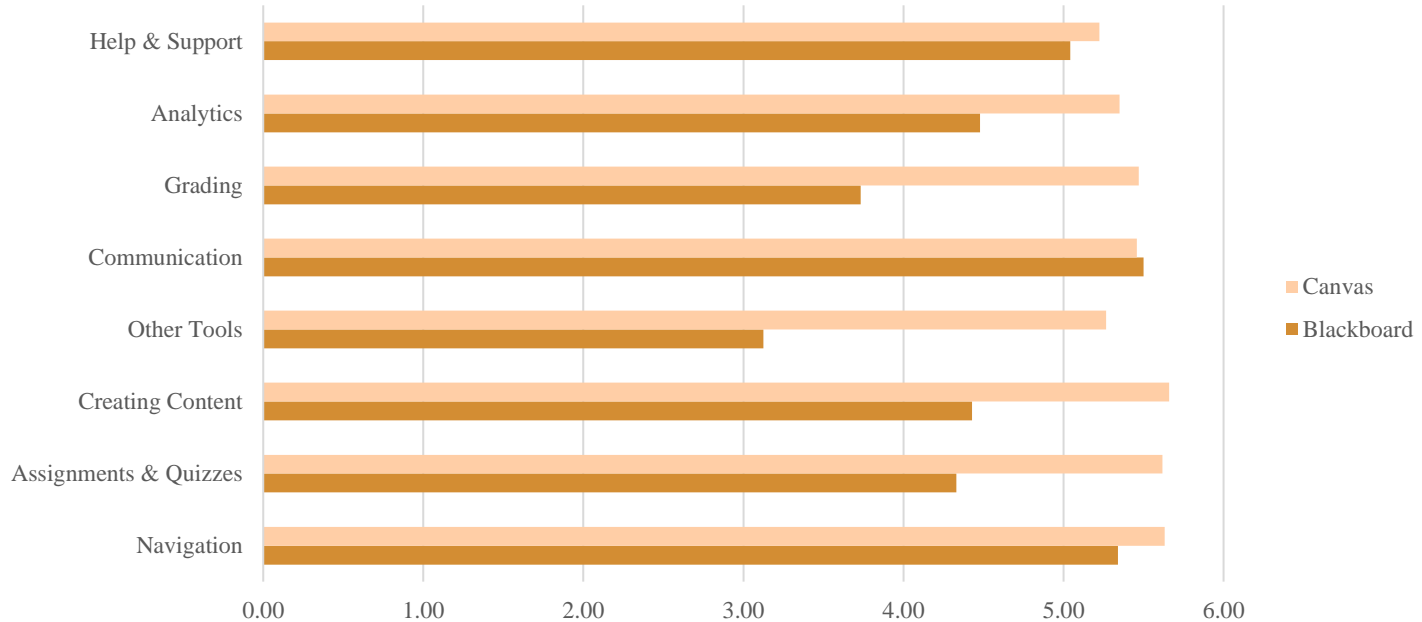
LMS Overall Score (Faculty)

LMS Overall Average (Faculty)



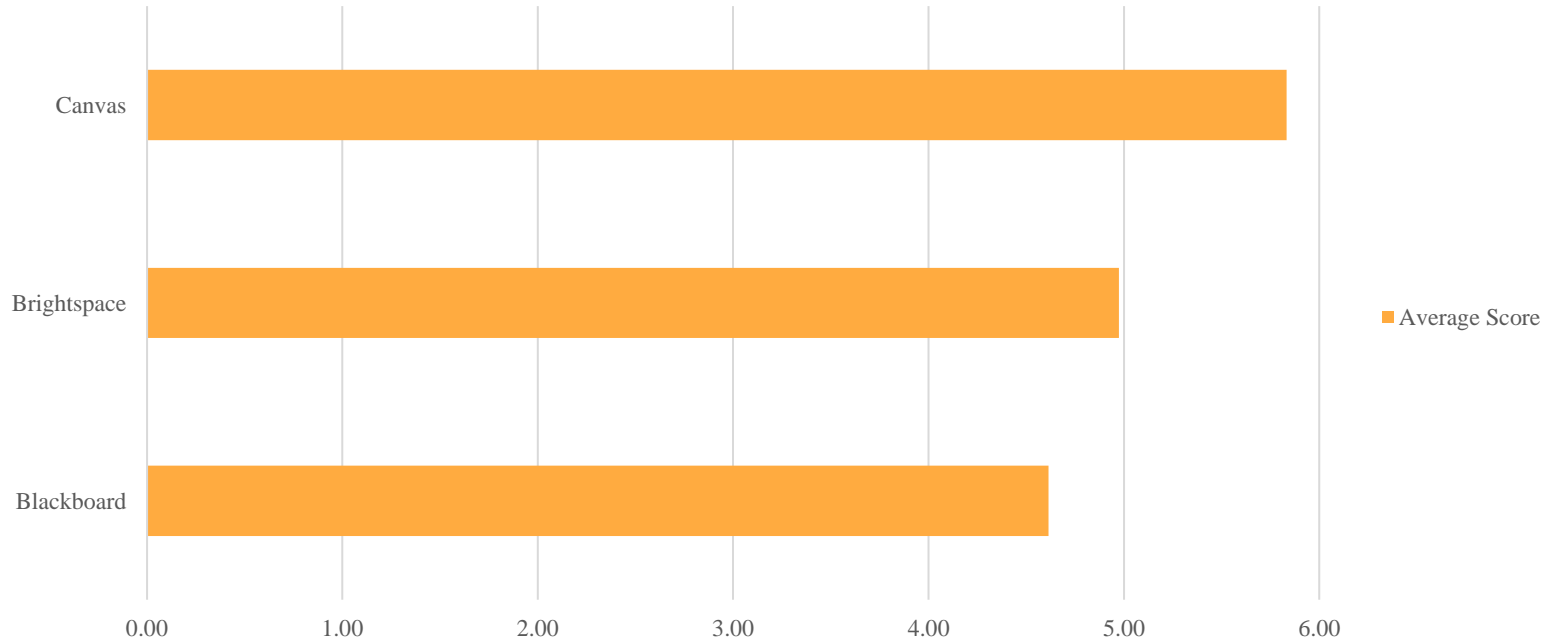
LMS by Category (Faculty)

LMS Average by Category (Faculty)



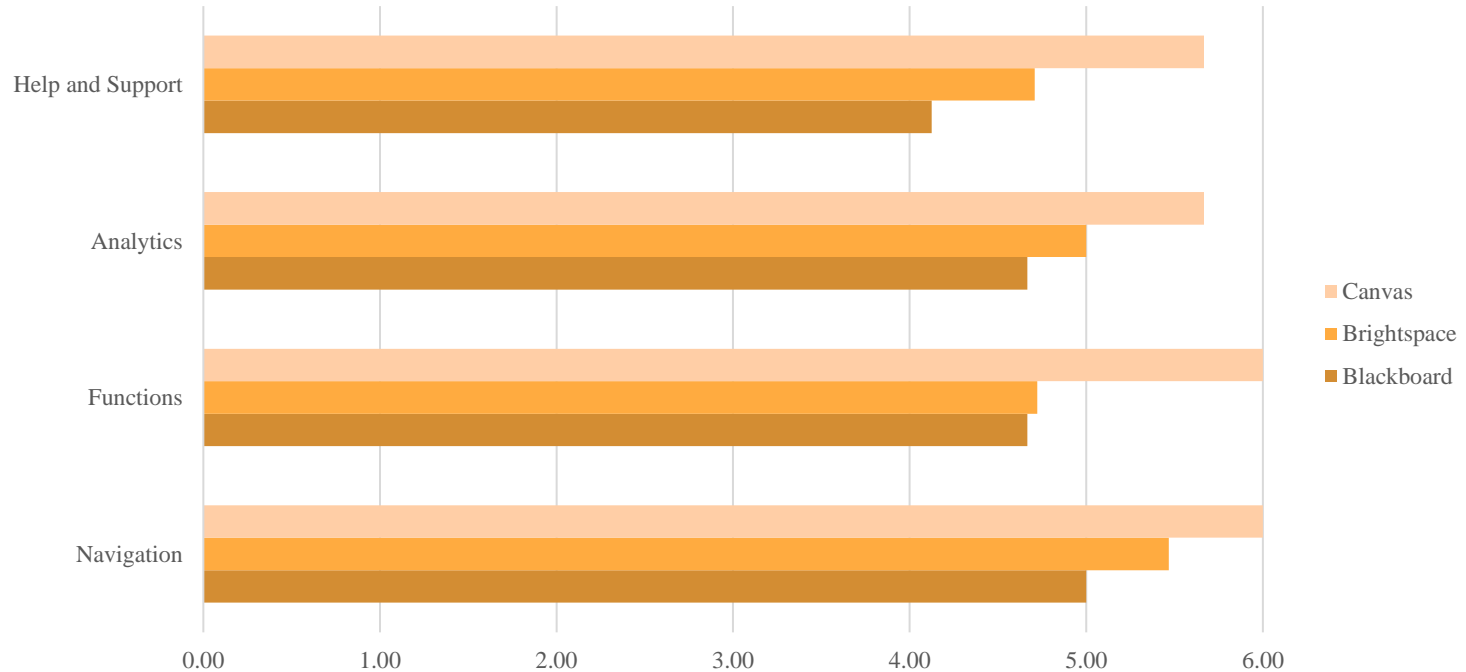
LMS Overall Score (Admin)

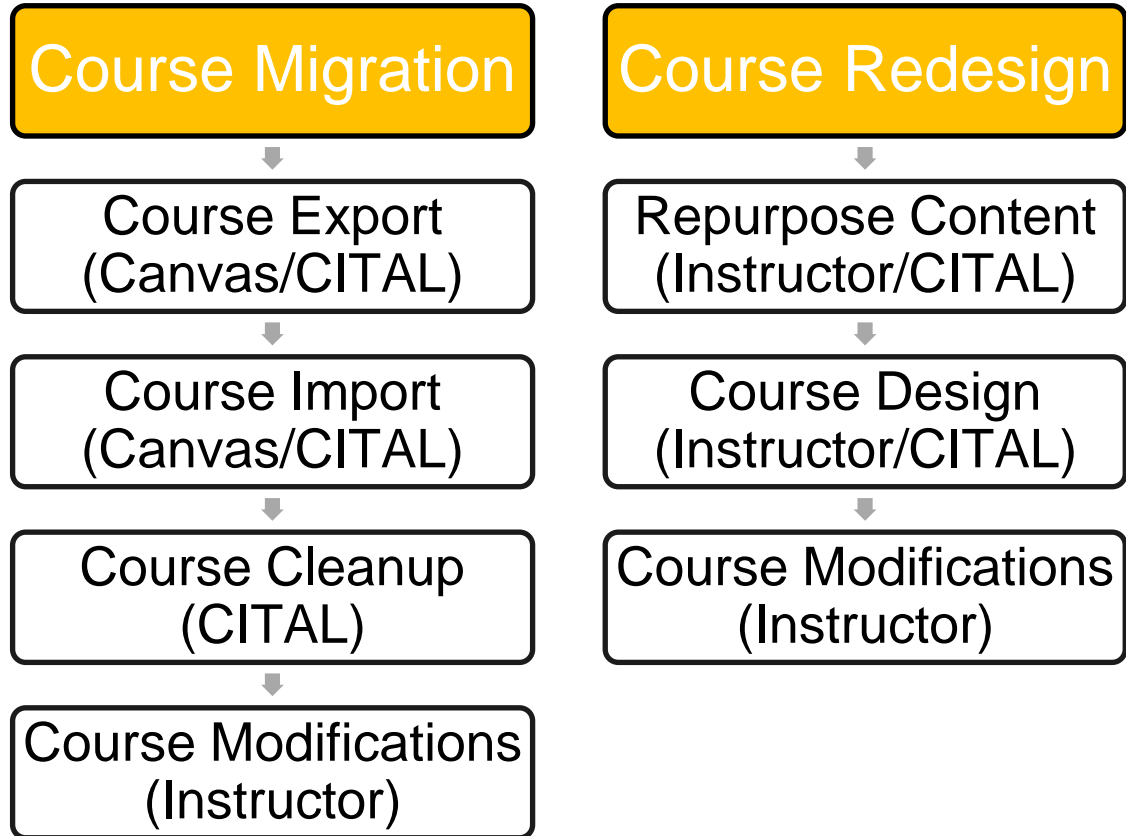


What We Get
